PASTOR'S CORNER

Last weekend I announced in this column that we had lost Cassie Spiker, and that I'd keep you all aware of the funeral arrangements. In fact, the family scheduled the funeral before any of you could even read the bulletin. Many got word all the same, by word of mouth or by media, and even if you didn't get the news in time, you can still assist the family, and Cassie herself, with your prayers.

I'd like to draw attention, once again, to the announcement a few pages south of here about the need for a Festival Coordinator. Or an organizing team, it needn't be just one person. This is the third appearance of the announcement, and so far, no takers. Of course, I understand that not everyone is in a position to do that work. Not everyone has the knack of organization, for one thing, and many people simply couldn't because of little ones, an overly-demanding work schedule, or other causes. But there must be someone, or a couple, or a team of several couples, who would be good at this and could step up? I met the Festival Planning Committee last Tuesday and it was decided that if we don't have any volunteers for this position by the end of the month, we will have to cancel this year's festival. The amount of work that goes into the planning and organizing of a festival, and the amount of time it would take the outgoing organizers to train the new team, would require about that much time. And if it happens that we cancel the festival for this year, I think we all know the festival will never be coming back. That's just the way things go: it's the principle of entropy in a human key. I hope that doesn't happen, because it would quite clearly affect the parish's ability to pay tuition subsidies to Bishop Fenwick School. We haven't been making a lot on festivals in comparison with the Gus Macker days, but we've the past several years we've been netting \$19K, and every little bit helps. Please think about it.

Lent begins March 1st. It's late this year (last year, in comparison, it began February 10th). The beginning of Lent is obviously reckoned according to Easter (40 days before). And here's a bit of fun knowledge: Easter (in the Latin Church) is reckoned by cosmic time: it's always the first Sunday following the first full moon after the vernal equinox. That's why Easter is not the same date from year to year, and why the date can even vary in date close to a month. This is in keeping with Jewish ways of reckoning feasts, as well as a reminder the fact that God's ways aren't our ways, and time belongs to God, and our clocks and calendars are a convention and artifice.

Anyhow, remember that Lent will be upon us soon, and think of some worthy ways of practicing self-denial during the holy season. Remember that fasting is required for all Catholics 18 to 60, and abstinence from meat is obligatory for all Catholics over 14. More on these in future issues.

PARISH MEMBERSHIP All parishioners should participate fully in parish life (*this especially means worshipping at Mass on all Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation*), be registered here, and contribute to the support the parish to the extent possible. We often get requests for recommendations and permissions for parishioners to serve as godparents and sponsors. If we don't know you, we can't give that testimony on your behalf. You may have been baptized here (or gone to Catholic schools) but you need to be currently practicing and registered in your local parish (children are obviously registered with their parents; adults need to make their own arrangements). The Church requires that baptisms and marriages be celebrated in one's own parish. If one is not an active parishioner, problems could arise at those important times.

Baptisms Usually 1st and 3rd Sundays. Contact the pastor to schedule. First-time parents please also schedule a "pre-Jordan" preparation class—offered the 2nd Wednesday of each month, at 7:15 p.m. in the parish center.

Weddings Active parishioners contact the parish office no later than six months prior to the desired wedding date. Marriage preparation normally includes several meetings with a priest, several meetings with a mentor couple of the parish, a weekend of conferences offered by the diocesan Office of Marriage and Family Life, NFP training, and FOCCUS diagnostic. *If someone in your family is planning to get married*, please encourage them to speak to their pastor. The marriages of Catholics (whether or not they're marrying other Catholics) need to be conformable with Church law, and that requires that they receive suitable catechesis in preparation for marriage, and marry according to a certain rite.

Eucharistic exposition Wednesdays following the noon Mass until 7:00 p.m. Benediction. For information, and to volunteer to take hours of adoration, contact Regina Cano at (614) 582-8588.

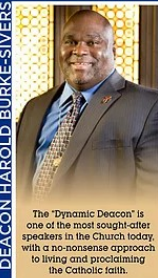

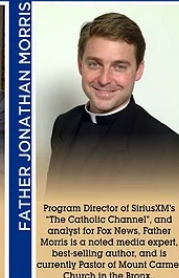

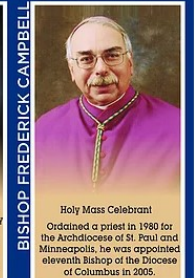
