PASTOR'S CORNER

In the Gospel this weekend we hear another parable about someone sowing seeds. In last week's, it was about seed that never came to maturity, for various different reasons. In this week's, it's about bad seed mixed in with the good. After the true farmer sows good seed, his enemy walks through his field at night




and sows bad—the result being that they grow up alongside each other—the weeds (or tares) being camoflauged until it's too late. The servants of the Lord of the harvest ask if they should go out and pull up the weeks, but the Lord wisely cautions against it: they will pull up many good stalks of wheat along with the bad if they do. So wait, and at the harvest they can be separated. And in his explanation Jesus explains that the enemy is the devil, who deliberately sabotages, or attempts to sabotage, the good that God intends to bring about. He can't plant good wheat, for he hasn't the power to give life, but he is a counterfeiter and can fool some of the people some of the time. So, in this age, the good are mixed in with the bad, and Jesus says that this is not outside of God's providence. Most of us are like the eager farmhands who want to go and start ripping up the weeds, not minding if we pull a few stalks of wheat. We secretly hope for the destruction of the evil and perhaps our own personal enemies—never thinking for a moment that in asking God to punish the evil now, we might just be asking for punishment on ourselves. God has something better in mind: the perfecting of the good by having them tested and strengthened through struggle. And giving evil people a chance to repent. For his power is shown more by drawing us away from sin to new life in him than by punishment.




